### Communicable Disease Surveillance Case Definitions

A surveillance case definition is a set of uniform criteria used to define a disease for public health surveillance. Surveillance case definitions enable public health officials to classify and count cases consistently across reporting jurisdictions. Surveillance case definitions are not intended to be used by healthcare providers for making a clinical diagnosis or determining how to meet an individual patient's health needs.

### Surveillance Case Definitions | NNDS

A clinically compatible illness that is laboratory confirmed, or in the absence of laboratory confirmation, a case meeting the clinical case definition and showing an appropriate response to treatment.

In October 1990, in collaboration with CSTE, CDC published Case Definitions for Public Health Surveillance (4), which, for the first time, provided uniform criteria for reporting cases to increase the specificity of reporting and improve the comparability of diseases reported from different geographic areas.

### MDHHS - Communicable Diseases (A-Z)

To protect Americans from serious disease, the National Notifiable Diseases Surveillance System (NNDS) helps public health monitor, control, and prevent about 120 diseases. These diseases are important to monitor nationwide and include infectious diseases such as Zika, foodborne outbreaks such as E. coli, and noninfectious conditions such as lead poisoning.

### EU case definitions - European Centre for Disease ...

A case definition is a set of standard criteria for classifying whether a person has a particular disease, syndrome, or other health condition. Some case definitions, particularly those used for national surveillance, have been developed and adopted as national standards that ensure comparability.

A communicable disease surveillance system serves two key functions; early warning of potential threats to public health and programme monitoring functions which may be disease- specific or multi-disease in nature. The early warning functions of surveillance are fundamental for national, regional and global health security.

Public health disease surveillance is the ongoing, systematic collection, analysis and interpretation of the who, what, where, when and how of disease case occurrence in a population.

### NC DPH: Communicable Disease Surveillance & Reporting

Nationwide standardized surveillance is necessary to provide consistent case identification and classification, measure the potential burden of illness, characterize the epidemiology of medically attended and moderate to severe COVID-19 in the United States, detect community transmission, and inform public health response to clusters of illness and efficacy of population- based non-pharmaceutical interventions on the epidemic.

Mandated reporters, such as health care providers, hospitals and laboratories, by law must report suspected or confirmed cases of certain infectious diseases electronically through Illinois' National Electronic Disease Surveillance System (I-NEDSS).
