Learn the Language of the Dermatology Exam. Primary Morphology. Macule - flat lesion less than 1 cm, without elevation or depression. Patch - flat lesion greater than 1 cm, without elevation or depression. Plaque - flat, elevated lesion, usually greater than 1 cm. Papule - elevated, solid lesion less than 1 cm.
