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**The Kurma Purana**

The Kurma Purana (IAST: KūrmaPurāna) is one of the eighteen Mahapuranas, and a medieval era Vaishnavism text of Hinduism. The text is named after the tortoise avatar of Vishnu.. The manuscripts of Kurma Purana have survived into the modern era in many versions. The number of chapters vary with regional manuscripts, and the critical edition of the Kurma Purana has 95 chapters.

The Bráhmí, Bhāgavatí, Saurí, and Vaishrávi, are well known as the four Sanhitás which confer virtue, wealth, pleasure, and liberation.

In his turn, Narad narrated it to Sutji who later narrated this Purana to an assembly of the great sages. Initially, this Purana had four parts namely Bramhi Samhita, Bhagawati Samhita, Gauri Samhita and Vaishnavi Samhita.
