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Perhaps the best thing Transcription Techniques for the Spoken Word does is make you realize that transcribing an oral history is so much more than "typing what they say." Even the simple instruction to produce a verbatim transcript leaves so much to be decided. This book should force you to think through the process before you get started.

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Step 1: Find a suitable audio clip. Some things to keep in mind as you pick yours: Start short: Just 30 seconds or one... Step 2: Listen once without trying to write anything down, just focusing on getting the big picture and general context. Step 3: Set up a blank Word / Google doc, or a pencil ...
